The high school World History classes have just finished a whirlwind study of World War I and World War II. The students created chronologies of each war and used data-based questions (DBQs) to explore the causes and the effects of each war. We are now exploring the causes and events of the Cold War. Mrs. Bublitz is excited to finally be discussing events that she has lived through,
 and the students are excited to finally be closing in on the 21 st century!


Biology students have been working on their Groundswell service learning project. Eighty plus students have worked for two hours outside on the school property removing invasive plant species and picking up trash. Some of the species were dug up while others had herbicide applied after cutting them down. Kent City shared some equipment--saws and dauber bottles--with Sparta schools. Autumn olive, honeysuckle, spotted knapweed and multiflora rose were some of the species students have learned to identify so that they can be removed. Hopefully native species will return to fill those spots.

## Information



Students in Algebra 2 have been studying periodic functions including rules that model circular motion. Angular velocity and linear velocity were calculated and compared as well as the motion of Ferris wheels, pendulums, daylight hours, and tidal depths. They have now begun their unit on Inverse Functions and coding schemes. Pre-Calculus students were busy learning about probability and counting situations. Examples of this are, how many ways can three items from the Boston Chicken menu of 16 side orders be selected or what is the probability of actually winning the Powerball. They are now learning fundamentals of calculus including instantaneous rates of change for things from tidal depths to fruit fly populations. Algebra 2A students have been busy learning about normal and binomial distributions including applications of finding percentiles for people's heights or test scores. They are answering question like, if $60 \%$ of American children age 3-5 are read to every night and 50 children's homes were selected at random, what is the probability that at least 42 of them have been read to.
Students have also been busy scheduling for next year and we are happy to announce that MTH-133 Calculus 1 at GRCC will again be offered first semester for seniors that have completed Pre-Calculus or will take it concurrently. Mr. Thompson will be the adjunct professor for this class so students can earn college credit without leaving our building once


On April 25th, choir and drama students attended a matinee of "Wicked" at the Miller Auditorium in Kalamazoo. This award-winning musical tells the back-story of Glinda, the Good Witch of Oz , and Elphaba, the Wicked Witch of the West, when they became roommates at college. We visited the South Kent Landfill where students were given a tour on top of the trash mountain and learned how the landfill manages the trash and harmful substances it creates.  Waste to Energy Facility where trash is burned to create electricity. Finally, the Recycling center takes all recycled items, groups them, and sells bales to companies that will reuse them. ## 6th Grade Science Camp

On Monday, April 29, seventy-seven Kent City sixth graders, along with nine parents and six teachers, headed off to YMCA Camp Pinewood near Muskegon for three exciting days of outdoor education. Rock climbing, team building skills, rope safety, and fishing were many of the activities they participated in.
On a night time nature walk, students heard the spring peepers and tried to call for owls. They also learned about night time vision in humans. During a daytime nature walk, students went through four habitats: upland forest, stream habitat, swamp habitat, and a vernal pond. Students learned about and saw sassafras, the American beech, hemlock, white pine, and skunk cabbage in the swamp. Some of the animals encountered were the Northern ribbon snake, Midland painted turtles, and Canada geese. They looked for red back salamanders and blue spotted salamanders. Many of each species were found and identified. They also learned the call of the red winged black bird "conkoreeee-a".
Students learned the essential materials needed for survival and the Rule of 3. In extreme situations, you cannot survive more than 3 minutes without air, 3 hours without shelter, 3 days without water, and 3 weeks without food. Students learned fire building
 skills and built debris shelters for survival.

## Groundswell Grant
