As the safety of our children remains our utmost priority, I wanted to take a moment to emphasize the importance of obeying crossing guards, particularly during drop-off and pick-up times.

Crossing guards play a vital role in ensuring the safety of pedestrians, especially children, as they navigate through busy intersections and crosswalks. Their presence is instrumental in facilitating the smooth flow of traffic and protecting our students from potential accidents.

However, we have noticed instances where some drivers do not fully adhere to the instructions provided by crossing guards. Disregarding their signals, whether intentionally or unintentionally, jeopardizes the safety of our children.

Therefore, I urge everyone to respect and obey directions from crossing guards at all crosswalks in the village. According to Michigan Compiled Law 257.613d "A driver of a motor vehicle who fails to stop when a school crossing guard is in a school crossing and is holding a stop sign in an upright position visible to approaching vehicular traffic is guilty of a misdemeanor."

March is Reading Month/Light the Night at KCMS

March is a very busy month at Kent City Middle School. During the month, students and staff celebrate "March is Reading Month" and participate in the Light the Night fundraiser. The month is capped off with an assembly leading into the start of Spring Break.

The theme for March is Reading Month this year was "Destination read". A travel theme because reading can take you anywhere. Activities include silent reading time during the school day, independent reading tickets and prizes, a door and locker decorating competition, and an assembly. **Silent reading** - each day of the month, students spent time silently reading in one of their classes. Reading tickets and prizes - for every 30 minutes of reading at home, students had the opportunity to fill out a reading ticket and enter it for daily prize drawings.

Door and Locker Decorating - during their WIN Seminar, students decorated their doors and lockers to match the theme for the month. Doors were judged at the end of the month to determine a winner

Assembly - the assembly to end March is Reading Month included games and other festivities. Light the Night - Kent City Middle School has been fundraising to support the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society every year for several years now. What started as "Pennies for Patients" is now "Light the Night," but the goal of raising money to support this organization has remained the same.

Fundraising - students raised a total \$2,513.19 this March.

Delay the Day activities - students were able to select from several different activities on the final day of school before Spring Break.

Luminary Walk - students were able to decorate paper bags in honor of individuals that they know who have had or currently have cancer. The bags are then illuminated and each class walked through to observe the bags that lined a walking path through the middle school gym.


Stuck for a Buck - this year students used duct tape to tape Mrs. Lafferty to the wall.

Preschool Students Become Museum Curators

Our preschool students have been busy learning about famous artists, natural history, and medieval times during their museum unit. Throughout the study, children have been creating exhibits to display in the library and preschool hallways for all to enjoy! All four preschool classrooms contributed to the museum project with art, collections and dinosaur and medieval-themed crafts.

The unit gave teachers a chance to talk about different types of museums, the role of curators and ways to sort and categorize objects. Students also practiced skills like navigating to exhibits with a map and interacting respectfully with objects on display.

The classes collaborated on a hallway castle display with paper knights and shields designed by students' families, as well as lining the hall with artwork and projects. The preschool teachers worked together to plan the projects, the overall museum layout and what artists they wanted to focus on.

To culminate the unit, families were invited to stop by and celebrate their learning by touring the museum and participating in a scavenger hunt.





Prevent the Summer Reading Slide

Over the summer, most children forget many of their reading skills, also known as the summer reading slide. Reading books every day over the summer is important to keep the brain ready for a great school year in the fall. Kent City Elementary has partnered once again with Kids Read Now, a non-profit organization focused on best practices for reading engagement and growth, to send FREE, NEW books to current K-3 students that they can keep forever! Each child's teacher will help them choose eight books at their reading level which they will receive throughout the summer beginning in late May or early June. A new book will arrive in the mail approximately every week. Students who report all

books in the KRN app or parent portal will receive a certificate and be invited to a KCE country hoedown for a rootin'-tootin' good time in the fall!
