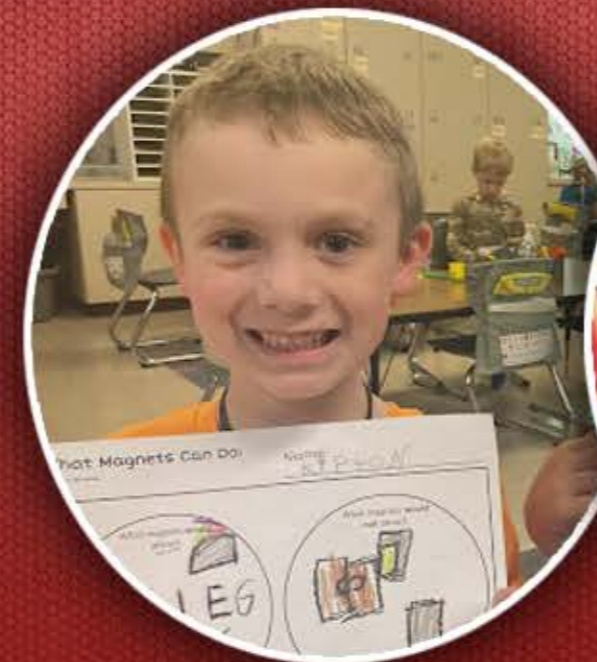
Ms. Sabin's Kindergarten
